ONE in ten

pokie players were aware that staff members knew their name or recognised them



were aware that gaming staff members monitored the gaming room

> while  $\frac{3\%}{0}$  of pokie players said that a staff member had spoken to them about their gambling

22% of those who played pokies in the past 12 months reported they spent more money on pokies when they drank alcohol

55% of moderate-risk gamblers said they were **Significantly** more likely to spend more on pokies when they drank alcohol than non-problem gamblers

of those who played pokies in the past 12 months said that they had no interaction in gambling venues

## The proportion of pokie players

who had no interaction with venue staff did not differ by Problem Gambling Severity Index (PGSI) score

64%

of those who had

played pokie in the past year said they had noticed advertising about help for gambling problems at a venue

Of these, 42% said that they read the information but did not think it was useful for them, and a further 38% did not take notice because they did not think it was relevant to them

of respondents were aware that venues with pokie machines are required by law to prevent customers' gambling from becoming harmtu

> However, nearly one half said they didn't know whether or not this was the case (49%)
